


StarFinds - Name that Constellation!



constellation. (All year)










In autumn and winter, look for a faint misty patch in the sky below the big V of this W-shaped constellation. That's Andromeda galaxy – the next galaxy beyond our Milky Way. It is roughly 25,000,000,000,000,000,000 km (15,000,000,000,000,000,000 miles) away – 2.5 million light years! (Autumn/winter)

If you go out at night to look for these, remember:


1. Some of them are only visible at some times of year.
